



As you may know, the City of Los Angeles has recently franchised trash removal services in our area. While we will still maintain a recycling and composting program at the building, the franchising has a direct impact on *how* we recycle going forward. **Please read below to find new guidelines for recycling and composting at 707 Wilshire.**

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

- **Cardboard:** Boxes must be flattened
- **Paper:** Any kind of dry paper is acceptable - newspaper, office paper, post-its, magazines, manila file folders, etc.
- **Beverage and Food Containers:** This includes all glass, plastic bottles, aluminum cans, and plastic and/or metal food containers. **Important: All items must be rinsed first.**

The recycling program is *Commingled Recycling*, which means all the above items can be disposed of in the same recycling container. There is no need to separate glass, from plastic, from paper, etc.

WHAT ABOUT COMPOSTING?

If your suite is participating in the food compost program, you should have a green food compost bin in your kitchen labeled "Food Waste Only." You can throw away **ALL** food including bones and shells.

Important: Please do not dispose of any type of paper, plastic, glass, or metal material in the composing bin.

WHAT ABOUT E-WASTE AND BATTERIES?

The building management has e-waste bins designated in the loading dock to capture all unwanted electronics. Please contact the management office for a pickup 213.614.2300 or submit a work order via www.shorenstein.com/angus.
